Rules Regarding Coaches' Clinics

- ASU coaches may not provide the coaches anything. Specific impermissible benefits at a Coaches' Clinic would include, but are not limited to:
 - Clothing, equipment, or gear
 - Prizes (including gifts from outside vendors)
 - Playbooks
 - Food, drink, and nominal materials (e.g., clipboards, file folders)
- A Coaches' Clinic may not be held at a high school or any prospect's educational institution.
- As a general rule, prospect parents should not be in attendance at the Coaches' Clinic.
- Recruiting conversations:
 - Coaches' Clinic: Since this is a coaches' clinic, conversations should about coaching.
 - Parent-Coach:
 - If a prospect parent is also the prospect's coach, communication with that parent-coach about their son will be counted as contact and, therefore, would be impermissible.
 - If the communication with the parent-coach is directly related to the evaluation of their son (e.g., athletics or academic skills, personality traits) and no recruiting takes place, it will not be counted as contact.
- Prospects may not be in attendance.
- Prospects may not serve as demonstrators.
- Other pertinent recruiting rules:
 - Head coach may not participate in an off-campus coaching clinic from April 15 May 31.
 - Only coaching staff members certified as off-campus recruiters may participate in the coaching clinic.
 - No off-campus contacts or evaluations may take place during a quiet period.
